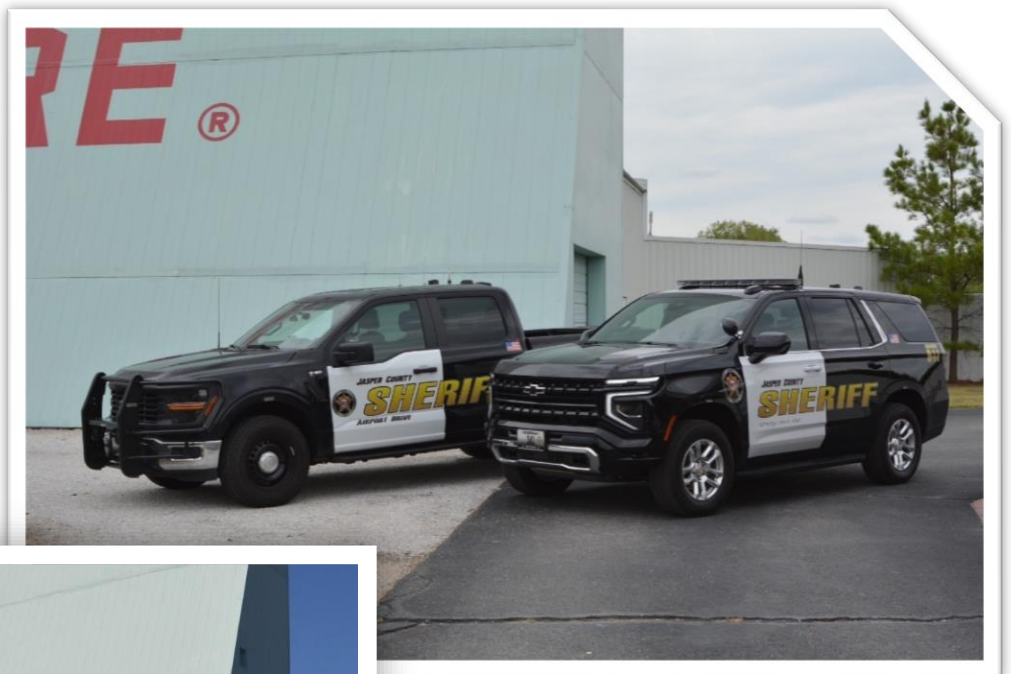

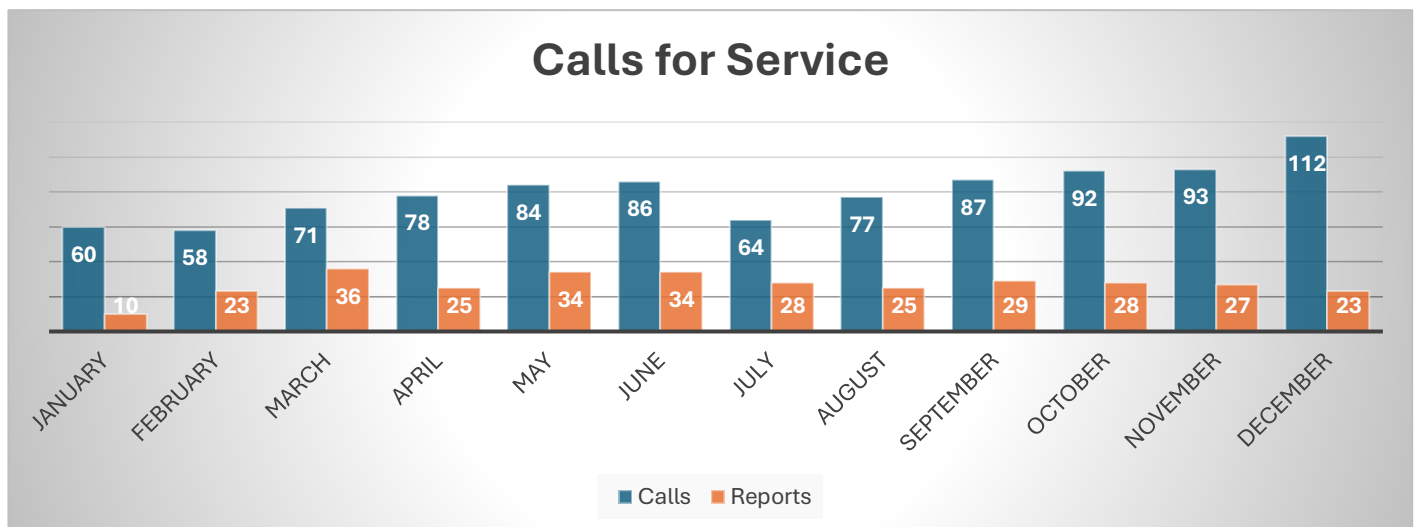
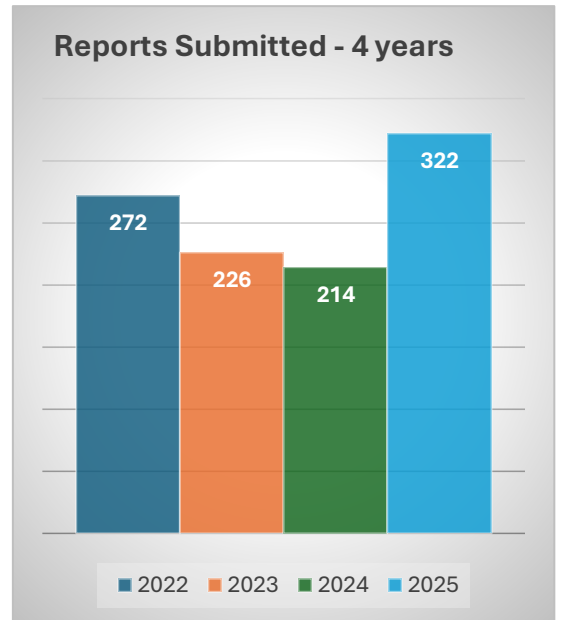

## LETTERS OF CODE VIOLATION

The Village of Airport Drive takes a proactive compliance-focused approach to code enforcement by prioritizing communication and voluntary correction or immediate penalties. When a potential code violation is identified, the Code Enforcement Officer issues a written notice outlining the concern, the applicable ordinance, and clear steps to remediation, giving property owners a reasonable opportunity to resolve the issue before any citation is considered. This process is designed to educate, encourage cooperation, and maintain neighborhood standards while fostering a respectful, problem-solving relationship between the Village and its residents.

In 2025, 25 Letters of Code Violation were mailed out by the Code Enforcement Officer with only 1 citation being issued after no remedies being completed by the property owner.
