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Election News

On April 4, 2023, terms will end for Trustees Terry Myers and Ray Bryant. When the filing period closed for the April 4th election on December 27, 2022, Mr. Myers and Mr. Bryant were the only residents to file for candidacy. Therefore, Terry Myers and Ray Bryant will continue to serve as Trustees for two more years. The Municipal Building will still be used as a polling location for the April 4th election for registered voters to cast their ballots for school board members and a Jasper County ballot guestion.

Besides serving as a Trustee, there are other ways to assist the community. Residents can serve on the Zoning Commission or the Board of Adjustment. These are appointed positions and the committees meet as needed. Residents can also serve as an Alternate to both boards. That is a great way to see how each board functions. Contact the Office if you are interested in serving on one of these boards.

The Trustees are discussing possible ballot questions for an August 8, 2023 ballot. In 2018, Airport Drive voters approved the question to adopt a provision of VAMS 115.124 which provides that if the number of candidates equals the number of open positions on the Board of Trustees, no election will need to be held. This ordinance must be approved every six years. The Trustees will also consider adding a ballot question to add an additional 3% Sales Tax on the sales of non-medical adult use marijuana. We will share more details closer to the election day.

CJ Fire Protection District

Over the last year, the Carl Junction Fire Protection District has been working with new software that helps them be better prepared to serve residents when called on. Within this new software is a program that allows residents to provide any information they feel the fire department might need in the event of a fire or natural disaster. This information can include your meeting place during storms, special needs considerations for your family, and even pet information. Once your profile is complete, you can login and let the fire department know if you are burning (if conditions allow) and even put in smoke alarm requests. Flushable Wipes. Are they really flushable?

If the label says "flushable", then wet wipes should be able to go down the toilet, right? Unfortunately no, they shouldn't. Toilet paper is designed to disintegrate in our pipes and sewage systems, but flushable wipes are not. They are typically made with synthetic material, plastics or polyester, that won't break down. So even if they flush down the toilet, they can end up clogging the sewer lines. This poses hazardous risks to the people that must break these clogs up; and incurs considerable costs. A "fatberg" is a huge mass of solid waste largely consisting of cooking fats, disposable wipes, and other sanitary items that get flushed

down the commode. They're unhygienic, expensive to fix and incredibly gross. Clogs and fatbergs make jobs that are already hazardous and very difficult even more so. Please dispose of wipes in the trash instead of flushing them.



Airport Drive plans to begin a Sanitary Sewer Evaluation Study soon. We will be working with TREKK Design Group, LLC. TREKK will perform the following tests on the lines.

Acoustic Sounding tests on the sewer lines to identify areas which may have diminished capacity or blockage.

Smoke Testing to identify I&I, Infiltration & Inflow, sources from the public and private sector. There will be a minimum of 48 hours advance notice to all residents within the study areas. Notification will be made by door hangers. The hangers will include general information about the testing, including instructions to fill infrequently used plumbing traps with water and a tablespoon of cooking oil to prohibit smoke from entering buildings via service lines.

CCTV (internal television inspections) and Cleaning based on the data gathered from the acoustic sounding and smoke tests. This will be a light cleaning of debris and any flow obstructions. If more effort is required, a **Heavy Cleaning** could be performed.

Funding for this work will come from the American Rescue Plan Act funds from the federal government.

I want to first thank Deputies Henry and Kolbeck for their hard work and commitment to the safety of the Village of Airport Drive. I also want to thank the community of Airport Drive for being so supportive not only of the Deputies but also of me during the transition to being the Supervisor over here; I truly enjoy working in the Village. Going into a new year, as always, we will look back on the successes, challenges, and areas to improve from the previous year.

A 2022 Annual Report has been completed to keep our community informed of crime and traffic reporting as well as trends over the last couple years. In 2022 the Deputies of the Jasper County Sheriff's Office responded to 997 calls for service within the boundaries of Airport Drive. They conducted 1,274 traffic stops; 198 citations were issued with 1076 warnings for traffic violations. There were 38 calls to report stealing, two burglaries and one robbery. These stats show me that Airport Drive is a safe place to live and raise your family.

Although Sue and Sharon are great to work with, it is not their job or responsibility to field calls for Deputies.

Water usage information for the year of 2022 was requested from Missouri American Water, Jasper County PWSD #1, and the City of Carl Junction. Village Engineer Clayton Cristy is working with Carl Junction and their engineers



to determine how much water is entering into their system and future sewer rates for Airport Drive.

In April we will request water usage information from the water companies for the first three months of 2023 to calculate averages for all residents and businesses. If you have experienced leaks or unusually high water usage during January, February or March of 2023, please contact the office. We will work to find the most accurate amount of water that entered the sewer system.



Building Permit Reminders

Planning to work on your home or property soon? Please contact the Village Office before work begins.

A Building Permit is required if you are building a new home, tearing out or building new walls, re-wiring, re-plumbing, re-roofing or building decks or fences. According to Section 400.020, no building or structure can be erected, moved, added to, or structurally altered without a permit issued by the Village Office.

If you hire someone to do the work, all contractors must be licensed to work in Airport Drive. Please instruct your contractor to contact the office before work starts. Contractors must provide proof of insurance before a license can be issued. There is a list of contractors already licensed to work in Airport Drive on our website: <u>airportdrivemo.com.</u>



Statewide Tornado Drill 2023

When is the Drill Held?

Missouri's 2023 statewide tornado drill will be held on Tuesday, March 7 at 10 a.m. This is an opportunity for Missourians to practice their sheltering plans and ensure readiness in case of a severe weather emergency while at home, work or school.

How to Participate

At 10:00 a.m. on the day of the drill, NOAA Weather Radios set to receive the Routine Weekly Tests (RWTs) will alert listeners that the tornado drill has begun. Outdoor warning sirens will also sound across participating communities in Missouri. At this time, participants should practice taking cover in their designated shelter.

Schools, businesses and families are all encouraged to participate in the statewide tornado drill. Schools are encouraged to use the tornado drill as an educational tool for students by incorporating tornado facts and mete-orological information and safety tips into their lesson plans.

Missouri's annual Statewide Tornado Drill is part of Severe Weather Preparedness Week, which includes:

Monday – Have a Plan/Receive Weather Information Day; Tuesday– Tornado Safety Day, including a statewide tornado drill at 10:00 a.m.; Wednesday – Lightning Safety Day; Thursday – Hail/Wind Safety Day; Friday – Flood Safety Day

The National Weather Service St. Louis Forecast Office has compiled information about all these weather threats and the safety measure to take in response at its <u>Severe Weather Preparedness Week site</u>.
